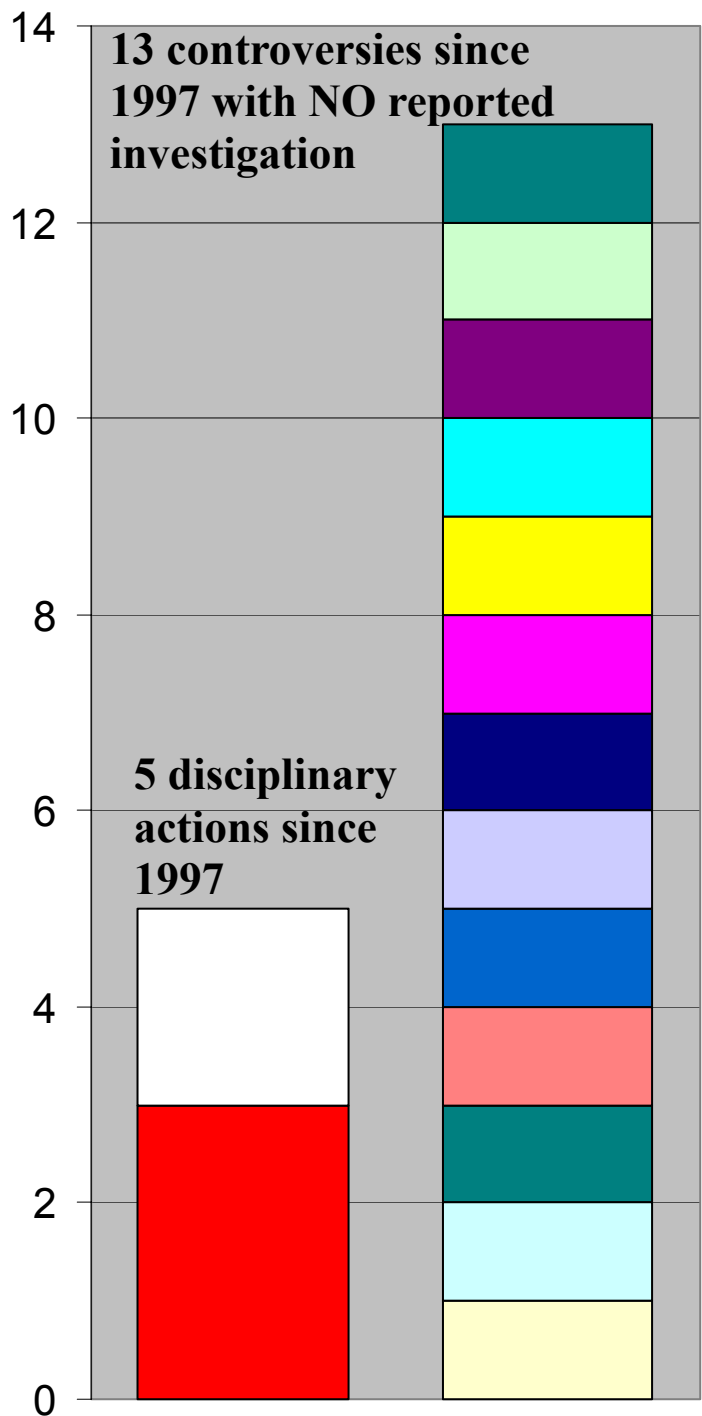


# A DECADE OF INACTION



- Billy Tauzin (R-LA) allegedly sought job with clients benefiting from bill he worked to pass. No reported investigation in 2004.
- John Conyers (D-MI) reportedly had staff work for political campaigns in Congressional office. No reported investigation in 2003.
- Nick Smith (R-MI) was allegedly offered financial support for son's Congressional campaign in exchange for his vote on Medicare prescription drug bill. No reported investigation in 2003.
- Mike Oxley (R-OH) reportedly forced lobbying firms to hire Republican lobbyists. No reported investigation in 2003.
- Paul Kanjorski (D-PA) reportedly steered \$9 million in contracts to family businesses. No reported investigation in 2003.
- Jim Moran (D-VA) accepted loan from MBNA, then supported bankruptcy bill in which MBNA had major interest. No reported investigation in 2002.
- John Murtha (D-PA) allegedly used government money and workers for campaign. No reported investigation in 2002.
- Gary Condit's (D-CA) extramarital affair with office intern. Condit was alleged to have obstructed the police investigation into her disappearance. No reported investigation in 2002.
- Tom DeLay (R-TX) reportedly offered meetings with Bush administration officials in exchange for campaign cash. No reported investigation in 2001.
- Jim Moran (D-VA) accepted \$25,000 loan from lobbyist and supported drug patent extension benefiting lobbyist's client. Accusation considered, but not investigated in 2000.
- Richard Pombo (R-CA) allegedly allowed lobbyist to write pesticide deregulation bill word-for-word in 2000. No reported investigation.
- Corrine Brown (D-FL) helped businessman in legal trouble; daughter received car from same businessman. Investigation halted for lack of evidence, 2000.
- Tom DeLay's (R-TX) ex-aide created war chest to aid House Republicans in 1999. No reported investigation.
- Two investigations since 1997 were undertaken by the House Ethics Committee after the Member pleaded guilty to a crime (Rep. Jay Kim, R-CA) or was convicted (Rep. James Traficant, D-OH).
- Three letters of reproof issued to Members for illegal loans w/ campaign funds (Rep. Hillard, D-AL), violation of "revolving door" statue (Rep. Shuster, R-PA), and using political money to pay for college class (Rep. Gingrich, R-GA; also fined \$300,000).
