Dear Ambassador Zoellick:

The State of Hawaii authorizes the U.S. Trade Representative to offer access to the Hawaii State government procurement market in new trade agreements that USTR is currently negotiating. These include trade agreements with Morocco, Australia, the countries of the Central American Common Market (Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua), the South African Customs Union (Botswana, Lesotho, Namibia, South Africa and Swaziland), and the Free Trade Agreement of the Americas. Hawaii will undertake the same commitments with regard to these new agreements that it has already undertaken under the WTO Agreement on Government Procurement.

This is in response to your letter requesting our assistance in the area of government procurement in trade negotiations and requesting that the State of Hawaii consider coverage of additional trade agreements now being negotiated by the United States. As a participant under the United States' membership in the World Trade Organization's Agreement on Government Procurement, the State has demonstrated its commitment to support the purpose of that Agreement. However, I request some additional time in which to review our obligations and responsibilities under this Agreement in order to make an informed decision regarding the inclusion of the additional new countries with which the United States is negotiating. I assure you that this need for additional time does not in any way represent the State's erosion of commitment to this Agreement and the goals and interests of the United States.
