**Supplemental Comments of Public Citizen
Regarding 49 CFR Part 533
Light Truck Average Fuel Economy Standards
Model Years 2005-2007**

RE: Relevant Ex Parte Communications Omitted from Public Docket

Dear Dr. Runge,

Public Citizen is concerned that particular ex parte communications between the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and the automobile companies Ford and General Motors were not made available to the public in the agency's docket. These emails, obtained by a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, are communications between the agency and manufacturers regarding the industry's baseline numbers for light truck average fuel economy.

Relevant communications between NHTSA and the auto industry should be made part of the public docket

The first email is from Ken Katz (the lead NHTSA Engineer on the rule) to Mark Kemmer from General Motors. This email, copied below, shows that the agency used industry "estimates for the fuel economy of each technology." Unfortunately, these estimates were never made public, nor were these direct communications.

Mark,

This is the spreadsheet that we used to analyze GM's fuel economy potential. The assumptions are listed up front on the first page. We used GM's estimates for the fuel economy improvement of each technology.

The second email, from Ken Katz to Walt Kreucher, the Manager of Vehicle Energy Planning shows that NHTSA used Ford's projections that were less than the manufacturers' public commitment to increasing its SUV fuel economy average by 25 percent.

Thanks for the clarification, Walt. We are relying on the numbers in the projections more than what the SUV pledge was, although I am aware that it was backed up with the numbers that I have seen.

I just wanted to remind you that the Ford SUV commitment included some products that are not included in CAFE. Backing these out of the commitment adjusts the 25% down to 22% for CAFE purposes.
