Victor Carrillo of Austin chairs the Texas Railroad Commission, which Perry appointed him to in 2003. He is a former Taylor County Judge, and previously served as an attorney in the energy section of the General Land Office. In that role, Carrillo was responsible for advising the state's land commissioner on oil, gas and environmental law issues. From 1988 to 1994, he was a petroleum geophysicist with Amoco Production Company in Houston. A graduate of Hardin-Simmons University, Carrillo received a master's of science degree in geology from Baylor University and a law degree from the University of Houston Law Center.



Jerry Patterson of Austin was elected in 2002 as the 27th Land Commissioner of the Texas General Land Office, where he oversees administration and stewardship of state lands and resources. Patterson served for six years as a State Senator from District 11. During his senate service, he passed legalization authorizing a constitutional amendment allowing home equity lending, the state coastal management plan and creation of the Texas State Veterans Home Program. A graduate of Texas A&M University, Patterson served in the United State's Marine Corps and the Marine Corps Reserve,



Sen. Ken Armbrister of Victoria has served in the Texas Senate since 1987. He chairs the Senate Natural Resources Committee and the Select Committee on Water Policy. He also serves as a member of the Business and Commerce, State Affairs and Government Organization committees. During his time in the Texas Senate, Armbrister has authored legislation creating the Edwards Aquifer Authority and was named by Gov. Perry to the Task Force on Homeland Security. Sen. Armbrister is a graduate of Sam Houston State University and the Federal Bureau of Investigation National Academy.



Rep. G.E. "Buddy" West of Odessa was first elected to the Texas House of Representatives in 1992. He currently chairs the House Energy Resources Committee and serves as a member of the House Environmental Regulation and Administration committees. He also chairs the Oilfield Clean-up Advisory Committee and serves as Vice-Chair for the National Energy Council which represents seven oil producing states and three foreign countries. He has been appointed a board member to the Council on State Governments and is a participant in the American Legislative Exchange Council and the National Conference of State Legislatures. West received his bachelor's degree in business management from the University of Texas of the Permian Basin.



Julie Parsley of Austin has served on the Public Utilities Commission since 2002. She previously served as the first female solicitor general in the Office of the Attorney General where she maintains an appellate practice before state and federal courts representing the State of Texas and its agencies. A member of the State Bar of Texas and the Texas Bar Foundation, she formerly served as an adjunct professor of appellate advice and litigation support at the University of Texas at Austin School of Law. A 1984 graduate of Texas A&M University, Parsley received a law degree from Texas Tech University School of Law in 1990.



Larry Soward of Austin was appointed by Gov. Perry to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality in 2003. Soward recently served as an executive assistant to Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst. Before joining the lieutenant governor's staff, Soward was the deputy land commissioner at the General Land Office managing the agency's operations. He also oversaw the operations of the Veterans' Land Board, the School Land Board and the Coastal Coordination Council on the commissioner's behalf. 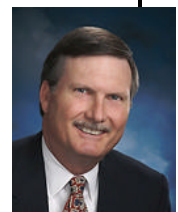
