

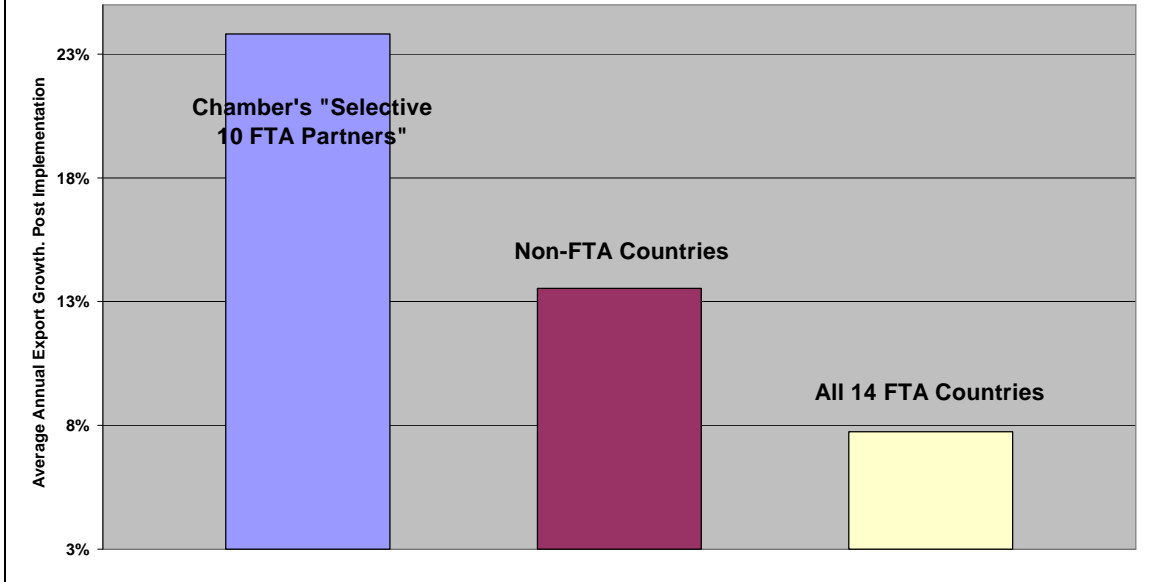

As can be seen from Table 1, the U.S. export growth rate to all FTA countries is only a third that of the Chamber's select 10 FTA countries. The U.S. export growth rate to non-FTA countries is roughly double that of FTA countries.
