

AFFIDAVIT

1 My name is Paul Carney. I make this statement freely and voluntarily, and hereby swear
2 under penalty of perjury that it is accurate and true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

4 I am a Consumer Safety Inspector with the U.S. Department of Agriculture Food Safety
5 and Inspection Service (FSIS). I have been an inspector for twenty-eight years, and I currently
6 work in FSIS's Santa Anna Circuit in southern California.

8 I am very concerned by recent statements made by the Department of Agriculture in
9 response to the discovery of a cow with mad cow disease in Washington state. As an inspector
10 with twenty-eight years experience I cannot agree that the U.S. beef supply is being adequately
11 protected against mad cow. I make this statement today because I do not think the public is
12 getting correct information or enough information about what USDA is doing - or not doing -
13 to prevent mad cow.

15 I can state, from first hand knowledge, that there is no systematic testing for mad cow in
16 the plants where I work or anywhere else in this District. The testing that does occur in the U.S.
17 is in a few scattered areas, and done on a completely voluntary basis. At the current time there is
18 no requirement that any beef producer test a single cow for this disease.

20 In addition, the testing that is carried out is without adequate controls or oversight to
21 make sure it is effective. Meat processing plant personnel do all of the sampling - they choose
22 which cows to test, they take the samples themselves and send them to Animal Plant and Health
23 Inspection Service (APHIS), or APHIS picks up the sample. The FSIS inspectors in the plant
24 have nothing to do with it. My point is that we can't verify that the sample is from a particular
25 herd or cow. We just trust the industry to pick out the most suspect cows from their own herds,
26 then we test those, and tell the public there is no mad cow.

27 We simply are not testing enough or with a process that has sufficient integrity to really

1 know whether this disease is in U.S. meat. Statements like the ones I have heard the Secretary
2 make are premature and irresponsible. To say that catching one cow proves that our testing is
3 effective at stopping mad cow from entering our beef supply is very misleading.

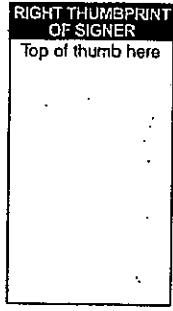
