While the Obama administration claims that the TPP would "improve on NAFTA," the relevant basis of comparison for the TPP is Obama's 2012 Korea "free trade" agreement. U.S. negotiators literally used it as the template for the TPP. In just three years, our goods trade deficit with Korea has ballooned more than 104 percent. So much for the "more exports, more jobs" promises made to sell the Korea deal — and now to sell the TPP. According to the trade-jobs ratio the Obama administration used to promise job gains from the deal, this trade deficit surge with Korea implies the loss of nearly 93,000 American jobs.
